MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL

I have a fondness for good old-fashioned hymns; I grew up on them in my church and came to love their deep meaning, melodies and words of truth that had such an impact on me as a young Christian.

A more modern one that I have now come to treasure is "How deep the Father's Love" by Stuart Townend. I find it to be especially relevant as we turn and focus our thoughts on Christ and what He has done for us over the Easter weekend.

*Verse 1: How deep the Father's love for us
How vast beyond all measure
That He would give His only Son
To make a wretch His treasure
How great the pain of searing loss
The Father turns His face away
As wounds which mar the chosen One
Bring many sons to glory*

This last week, we presented our class items to our School community at the Easter Assembly. I sat back and listened to the words that were being spoken, sung or acted out and took time to let their meaning wash over me. Every class and item spoke to the vast, deep and unfathomable love that God has for us, His children. There can be parts of the Easter message that are hard to hear and listen to, many parts that are gruesome and graphic, but through it all we see God's deep love for us highlighted.

When we become a Christian we realise, maybe for the first time and often at a much deeper level, that the God of the Universe loved us so much that He gave His Son as a sacrifice in our place, as God cannot abide sin. Surely we have to be humbled and convicted of that cost?

*Verse 2: Behold the Man upon a cross
My sin upon His shoulders
Ashamed, I hear my mocking voice
Call out among the scoffers
It was my sin that held Him there
Until it was accomplished
His dying breath has brought me life
I know that it is finished*

If God could not abide sin, then there needed to be a way for us to be cleansed, to be washed clean, so that we could be made right with God. That's where we come to the cross. We see God give His Son in our place. We see that He bled and died for us. His blood covered our sins and allows us to have a right relationship with God; free from judgement, guilt or shame.

Death on the cross was a harsh and cruel way to die and I wonder what my thoughts would have been had I been one of those to witness Jesus' death in this way? Would my voice be **among the scoffers** or would I have realised that the Son of God was before me and how that moment would change history for ever? Would I have seen Jesus for who He was?

*Verse 3: I will not boast in anything
No gifts, no power, no wisdom
But I will boast in Jesus Christ
His death and resurrection
Why should I gain from His reward?
I cannot give an answer
But this I know with all my heart
His wounds have paid my ransom*

Why **should I gain** from what God has done for me? What have I done to deserve His sacrifice and love? Won't there be times that I let Him down and that I don't do as I should? Of course, there will be, but the beauty of my salvation (being made right with God) is that judgement is behind me and **his wounds have paid my ransom**.

By the time you read this article, Easter will have passed. I trust that you and your family were able to find time to read and reflect on what Christ has done for us in His death, burial and resurrection. We all love a story with a good ending, a tale that sees good victorious over evil, and there can be no truer account of this happening than in the Easter message.

UTAS SCIENCE AND ENGINEERING CHALLENGE



OPERATION WALLACEA– OPPORTUNITY FOR YEAR 10 STUDENTS



Year 10 students,

The following is information received from Dr Tim Coles, OBE, the Project Director and Founder of Operation Wallacea.

A field ecology and data analysis course will be based in Mt Burr Swamp in Southern Australia in September/October this year. The programme is specifically designed for Australian high school students who are looking for an opportunity to see what real field work is like and learn how to collect and analyse biodiversity data.

The expedition will be run in conjunction with the Nature Glenelg Trust at Mount Burr Swamp which is a wetland site that is currently under restoration and is located just north of Mount Gambier. The reserve is home to six nationally threatened species and is also one of the most floristically diverse nature reserves in South Australia.

- 6-day course
- Surveying techniques learned for herpetofauna, mammals, invertebrates, birds and plants
- Contribute data to this ongoing restoration project
- Data analysis training using raw data from our sites in the Caribbean, Mexico or South Africa
- Training in GIS mapping and R analysis software (taught at Australian universities)
- Fundraising support provided
- Strengthen applications for further education or employment

The webinar will also cover the online work experience placements that we offer to students. We have seen that many students are struggling to obtain relevant and useful work experience in the wake of Covid-19. Operation Wallacea, who run overseas biodiversity research projects, has a team of experienced researchers, designers, marketers, and project managers. Due to the global travel restrictions these teams are not running their usual projects for the next few months and so there is an opportunity for them to provide support and tuition for a limited number of high school work placements in a range of topics including medical, science & geography, project management, business & marketing & photography.

RELAY FOR LIFE 2021



NAPLAN UPDATE 2021

NAPLAN will run on both the Ulverstone and Burnie Campuses, with a start date of Tuesday 11 May. Parents have been sent an information sheet about this via EdSmart. Should you have any concerns about the test, your child completing them or our School processes, please contact your child's classroom teacher ASAP.

The National Assessment Program-Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) was first undertaken as an online test in Tasmania during 2019. Tasmanian Schools will again participate in NAPLAN Online this year.

NAPLAN Online provides better assessment and more precise results. The assessments feature a tailored test design where the questions a student receives will depend on their answers to previous questions.

NAPLAN testing will be held from **Tuesday 11 - Friday 21 May 2021**.

Online testing will be available for each of the NAPLAN Year levels (3, 5, 7 and 9).

NAPLAN assessments include four components: Writing, Numeracy, Conventions of Language and Reading. Please note that all Year Three students will be completing a paper-based Writing Test.

Schools will receive reports and results for participants following the completion of the NAPLAN Online assessment window. These Individual Student Reports will have the same format as in previous years. This format is used for every student in Australia.

Leighland Christian School provides a number of fee payment options and policies to ensure Christian education is not outside the reach of families. The structure of our fees provides sibling discounts and parents will only ever pay for three children at school at any one time, assisting larger families with over three children at school. The philosophy is that parents who can afford to pay full fees should do so and that the Board will make Christian education affordable to low income families through the Fee Assistance process.



MINIMAL LEVY STRUCTURE

Leighland Christian School has only a few levies unlike many other schools that levy or charge the parent for every activity.

- In Year 11 & 12, some specialist subject choices attract a \$300.00 levy per subject per year to cover the additional expenses incurred.
- VET subjects can incur additional levies. These levies go toward the cost paid to external organisations to deliver a wide range of vocational courses. The School subsidises the cost of VET levies for our School families.
- For families travelling in from the Wynyard or Somerset area, there is a set levy of \$350.00 per year, per family to facilitate affordable travel (\$8.75 per school week) to the Burnie campus. This bus is provided by the School.






