Do we really believe God has good plans for us, even when the plans we've made go up in smoke? Then, in the midst of the smoke, do we genuinely believe God will bring good from it?



MISSION

LinC's mission is to serve and connect the School community.

The parent body partners with the wider school community, including students and teachers, to help foster a loving, inclusive and engaged community. Linc is actively involved in the life of the School through a wide range of projects and events that are conducted around a Christ-centred approach, where love, support, grace and encouragement of others is evident and inviting.

STRUCTURE

The Schools' CRO (Community Relations Officer) is the main contact person for each of the Committee Coordinators and the Campus Treasurer. They are supported by the Principals, who have final veto on the decisions made and the funded projects for their campus.

LinC consists of a set of Committees that parents and guardians can elect to join, depending on where their individual gifts and talents lie. The Committees will be published each year, through an EdSmart form, which then allows parents and guardians to select the areas that they would like to contribute to.

Each Committee will have a Coordinator, that is appointed by the Campus Principal in consultation with the CRO and those interested in the position. Leighland Christian School believes everyone has a God given ability to show love and grace to the School community and beyond, through active, planned and enthusiastic contributions. We encourage everyone to become part of one of the Committees.

There will be a Treasurer appointed on both the Ulverstone and Burnie Campuses by the Campus Principal. All fundraising and purchases/use of the monies raised will be announced to the School community. Training is also provided to support and equip this position. The Treasurer will demonstrate leadership qualities and an ability to work with a team of parents and guardians to see the School community grow and flourish. WHAT IS LINC?

LinC's key task is to provide our families with opportunities to connect, to contribute and to feel a valued part of the School community, across both campuses.

At Leighland Christian School, one of our foundational beliefs is that we are in partnership with the parents and guardians in the education of their children, as we actively look for opportunities to work together.

LinC and its branched Committees will operate in harmony with each other to provide all parents and guardians the opportunity to be more fully engaged with the School community. We appreciate that strong, positive relationships need to exist between home and school, and that this harmonious relationship is in the best interest of the children in our schools.

MEETINGS & EVENTS

There is one meeting a term with the Principal, CRO, Committee Coordinators and any others who may be interested in attending.

A meeting agenda, including a devotional message and reports by the Committee Coordinators will be given, either verbally or in written form, if they are not able to attend. Committee meetings will be held when a relevant event is coming up, or as needed.

Community Catch-ups are held on both campuses twice a term with the CRO (Community Relations Officer) to provide opportunities for parents and guardians to connect with each other in a casual and relaxed way.

All meetings are advertised on the school's social media pages and in the newsletter. Parents and guardians who are not Committee Members are always welcome at these meetings.

Committee Coordinators are published at the start of the school year so that parents and guardians can make contac with them over the course of the year.

New committee members are always welcomed and encouraged at any time of the year.

SPECIAL EVENTS COMMITTEE




Time commitment: Several opportunities to serve over the course of the year

This warm, non-judgmental approach to exploring attachment is practical, kind, scientific, appropriately challenging, and wonderfully gentle.

City of Burnie Brass Band Transition Program



WHAT IS GET BRASSY!?

The City of Burnie Brass Band Transition Program – Get Brassy! is designed for brand new players who would like to learn a brass instrument and young players looking to strengthen their skills.

The twice weekly, 10-week program seeks to ensure that students:

- Develop confidence in reading basic music notation (focussing on the names of notes, key signatures and interpreting rhythms).
- Are able to quickly and independently identify the notes in a piece of music and accurately
 play these notes on their instrument.
- Learn to play in a small group setting working cooperatively with others.

WHERE DO YOU REHEARSE?

Rehearsals take place at the City of Burnie Brass Band Rooms which are located at Parsonage Point, West Park, behind the Makers Workshop and close to the Penguin Centre.

Rehearsal sessions will run for 30 minutes. The specific days and times of rehearsals will be confirmed based on the needs and availability of applicants.

WHO CAN JOIN?

The program is FREE to all of our current Development Band members.

In addition, we have five places available for new members who are in Grades 3-6. For new members, we are offering a \$50 half year membership fee.

This cost covers:

- Small group, individualised tuition (all tutors have Working With Vulnerable People Cards)
- · Instrument hire for the remainder of the calendar year
- Practice folder and music

WHAT HAPPENS AFTER 10 WEEKS?

On conclusion of the program, new players will be invited to become an official member of the City of Burnie Brass Band and transition to our weekly Tuesday Night Development Band Program. Players will also be invited to swap their P-Cornet for a brass instrument. They will have the opportunity to choose whether they would like to continue with cornet, or move on to one of our other available brass instruments (tenor horn, baritone, euphonium, trombone or tuba).
