## **MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL**

My office on the Burnie Campus has glass windows that look out over the Undercover Area but the view from my desk has changed considerably over the past weeks and months. Usually I see children running by, playing with their friends, laughing and chatting, or parents picking up their children at the end of another day of learning.

Something wonderful is happening close to my window as a little bird builds her nest in the ferns that grow there. She has busily built up her home in a place that she feels is safe, is well camouflaged and where she can safely lay her eggs. She has collected items from around the School, including twigs, leaves, sticks and even some shiny pieces of plastic to build this perfect little nest.

The other thing that has changed my view is the new Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts and Math (STEAM) Centre as well as the Learning Enrichment Centre (LEC) that have been planned and purpose built to engage our students and their academic inquisitiveness and development. These state of the art facilities are designed to engross students, to have them think differently, to question and ask 'why', to comment on others' work and to take them through a design and make process. It is bright, colourful, welcoming and an exciting place to be.

Our God Aware Leighland Learner traits highlight that we want to develop children who can purposefully plan and create while providing activities where they can be reflective, innovative, motivated and relational. Young people need to try new ideas to see if they work, they need to think differently, ask advice, work as a team, or individually, to see a desired outcome.

Our Campus verse for the year is Luke 6:48:

"He is like a man building a house, who dug deep and laid a foundation on the rock; and when a flood occurred, the torrent burst against that house and could not shake it, because it had been well built." I chose this verse very deliberately, as I knew that this year would be one where we saw our School footprint grow as these buildings and MPEC were completed and opened. We needed to be reminded that our foundations are what holds the building steady and what anchors it to be able to withstand any storms that come its way.

Just as we had to ensure that our builders dug deep to lay the foundations of our new buildings, and the little bird needed to find a safe and sure foundation to build its nest, even more importantly we need to maintain the fundamental and foundational Christian principles that our School was built on.

It is one of the greatest blessings in my role to be able to show families around our School and to let them know how God is working to see Leighland Christian School provide authentic and well-resourced Christian Education. We need to hunker down in those foundations and not be swayed from them as God has so much more to achieve through His Schools here in Burnie and Ulverstone.

# ARE EXTERNAL ASSESSMENTS GOING AHEAD?

At this stage, external assessments are scheduled to go ahead with <u>COVID-safe</u> <u>practices</u> in place, in line with the published timetables.

Safety measures won't change how you experience your exams and assessments, however, it's important to consider the information below.

# WHAT DO I DO WHEN I ARRIVE AT MY EXAM?

You will need to follow the instructions given by Exam Supervisors, the signage at Exam Centres and bring the personal supplies needed to complete the exam.

#### IS MY EXAM CENTRE COVID-SAFE?

TASC is working with your school / Exam Centre to ensure that additional COVID-safe hygiene practices are in place including:

- hygiene stations with hand sanitiser set up outside exam rooms
- signage reminding you about COVID-safe practices and behaviours
- physical distancing of desks for written exams in line with usual practice
- cleaning of shared equipment such as desks and chairs, and high touch points in exam rooms between every exam
- encouraging fresh airflow in exam rooms where possible, as long as this doesn't create noise disturbance.

#### CAN I ATTEND AN EXAM IF I'M UNWELL?

You must not attend an exam if you have any COVID-19 symptoms, or if you are in isolation awaiting a test result. If you attend exams while experiencing cold or flu like symptoms, a senior staff member from your school will speak with you about returning home and the steps you need to take.

# WHAT IF I HAVE HAY FEVER SYMPTOMS?

If you have hay fever symptoms you need to follow advice on 'Hay fever and COVID-19 symptoms'. Managing your hay fever symptoms is vital to ensure you can sit your exams.

Get tested for COVID-19. Visit your GP to learn how to manage your symptoms and obtain a medical certificate to prove that while your eyes may be itchy, you're still okay to sit your exams.

# WHAT IF I NEED SOME SUPPORT?

Don't hesitate to ask for help. There are people who can assist you. Reach out to family, friends and your teachers or others at your school.

Teachers will be available at the beginning of every exam to support you. This includes making sure everyone is using COVID-safe behaviours and providing advice if you've arrived at your exam displaying COVID-19 symptoms.

#### WHAT IF I CAN'T SIT MY EXAM?

You will need to follow the information about what to do if you experience <u>illness and emergency</u> <u>during exams</u>. This includes how to use the TASC Medical Certificate if you are sick or you have possible COVID-19 symptoms. You can also contact <u>TASC</u> for more information.










# ONLINE WORKSHOP TASMANIA
