MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Leading through the Struggle

Recently I attended a CEN Conference, aptly named “Leading through the struggle” with several other staff from Leighland Christian School. Over the course of two days we were immersed in God’s word, led through sessions related to the topic and we also had the chance to connect with teachers and leaders from CEN schools across Australia, albeit by Zoom.

Rod Thompson from CEN National was one of the Keynote Speakers and he unpacked the concept of struggle from a Biblical perspective. He addressed the thought that many Christians have sought to be free from struggle, and provided a counter argument to this, that in fact we are designed to engage with it and should expect struggle to be a part of our story, just as God’s people in the Bible faced many trials and triumphs.

He went so far as to say that struggle is an identifying feature of God’s people.

How much easier would our lives be if that was not the case, or would it?

If life never challenged us, what kind of people would we be? If our faith never faced The Refiner’s Fire, how strong and resolute would we be? If we didn’t know what it was like to struggle, would we know what it was like to triumph? If we didn’t face hard times, would we know to run to God for His loving grace and protection or would we run from it because we were self-reliant? Would we recognise our sinfulness and then miss the need for a Redeemer who came to seek and to save us?

Living in the Struggle

Rod Thompson went on to remind us that TRIUMPH is realised in the STRUGGLE and that there is a beauty and harmony in the balance that this brings.

He suggested that there are several things we can do to ensure that we are prepared for the struggles when they come and in whatever form they may take. These included:

- Immersing yourself in the scriptures, the only grounds for life
- Praying and asking God to help you
- Maintaining strong relationships and friendships – people who know you well and can support you
- Keep dealing with the sin in our own lives
- Lamenting and taking time to be still and quiet, to find a way to settle into the silence
- Celebrating and looking for the truths, the beauty, taking time to refresh
- Being mentored and intentional in relationships with someone who has been in the struggle longer than you have or been there before
- Practice and persevere in the helpful rhythms of life

His summation was that if I do all of these things then I have a chance at winning and triumphing through any struggle.

May God bring you some peace and encouragement from these wise words as you face your own struggles and TRIUMPHS today.

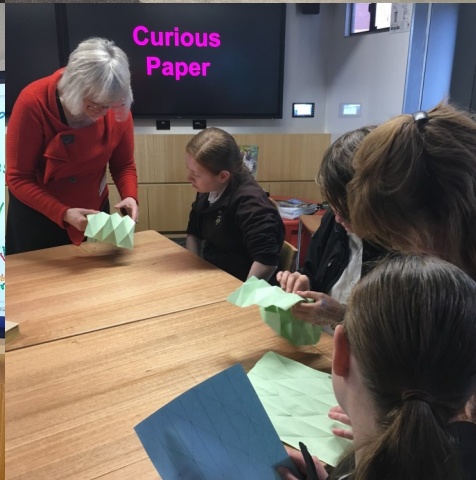
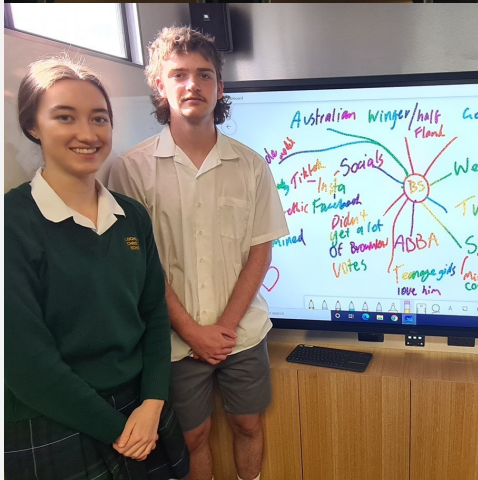

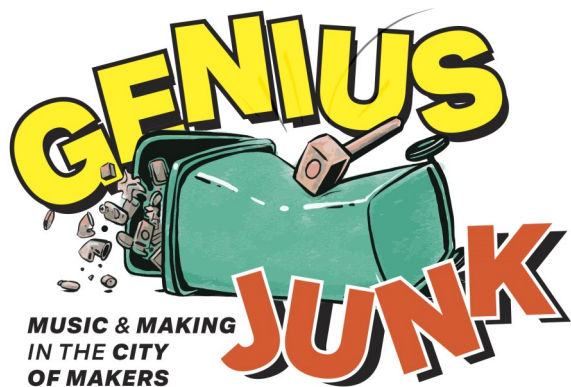
